gloria (student): diversity of tribes, cultures, languages that exist in Indonesian society.

Sriwinda malimbung (student): mutual respect and respect for the differences that exist in our environment.

Lovely (student): respect and acknowledge the diversity of Indonesian culture and where we are.

Zulkifli Amir (student): from what I understand about multiculturalism, differences in culture, religion, race and language that exist in every level of Indonesian society.

Based on research data that every student who comes to school has a different background, the diversity that exists in the school students learn to respect and respect the differences in culture, religion and race that exist in the environment wherever they are. The diversity of student backgrounds can foster a sense of brotherhood. Severe students have learned about multiculturalism in sociology subjects. The lessons of multiculturalism itself are not only learned from one subject but they also learn from other subjects. And the most explaining about the term multiculturalism is in sociology lessons. Lovely Mandolang (student): the teacher explained how diverse society is in Indonesia from Sabang to Merauke, not only in Indonesia but throughout the world, it is very diverse.

Zulkifli Amir (student): when the learning material the teacher gave an example of the diversity in Indonesia and gave a group assignment, by doing a presentation in front of the class.

Based on research data, teachers play a very important role in providing an understanding of the values of multiculturalism. To instill the importance of multicultural values, teachers must provide lessons that can be understood directly by students, one example of which is the issue of the dangers of multiculturalism conflict. Students must understand that living in harmony, respecting and appreciating differences is much more positive than having to get involved in a conflict that can cause chaos. In each lesson, teachers usually provide their own strategies in providing an understanding of multiculturalism indirectly. In related lessons, it is usually explained that Indonesian society is very diverse consisting of various tribes and nations from Sang to Merauke. Guruh also provides awareness for students to behave pluralistically and democratically in responding to all differences that exist in society. Noel Loring (student): one of them is the values of tolerance towards friendship or being in the community and not forcing them to follow our worship.

Gloria (Student): respecting each other among friends without distinguishing between their race or religion and avoiding debates that will cause conflict. Sriwinda Malimbung (student): working together between groups or individuals with someone who has a different background.

Lovely Mandolang (student): the value of tolerance by providing space and time for friends to carry out worship.

Zulkifli Amir (student): tolerance towards those of different religions without forcing our beliefs on others From the research data, students already have an attitude of tolerance towards friendship regardless of race and religion. It can be seen from students who have absolutely no problem in the scope of friendship and work together in every learning activity carried out in groups or individually. With the attitude of tolerance possessed by students, it will help strengthen, increase

comfort, peace and harmony in friendships at school without having to experience differences that can become conflicts and students who have positive characters. By knowing the values of multiculturalism, students can strengthen the emergence of a sense of appreciation for the differences in their environment so that an attitude of tolerance arises and strengthens students' character. d. From the questions given related to, Do You Understand the Values of Multiculturalism? The informant gave the following answers.

Lovely Mandolang (student): We were taught in sociology and civics subjects that what caused the riots that had fatal consequences was the lack of tolerance and forcing our will on someone.

Zulkifli Amir (student): Yes, I understand the values of multiculturalism, namely respecting religion, culture and groups because this school is already multicultural. Interview May 21, 2024

Based on data from student research results indirectly about the values of multiculturalism in the school environment. Students have indirectly learned about the basic principles of multiculturalism, namely respecting and acknowledging the diversity of groups including ethnicity, religion, race and culture, as well as differences in interests that all have their own meaning. Grade X students already understand the values of multiculturalism because they have learned in subjects and lessons about the diversity of society are also in the PPKN subject. f. From the questions given, in everyday life, how do you formulate these values? The informants gave the following answers:

Gloria (student): I myself have implemented these values by using polite language in class and outside the classroom that can offend the culture and religion of my school friends.

Sriwinda Malimbung (student): When my friends are fasting we in one class do not ask them to pray and at lunch time we try so that our Muslim friends do not see us eating.

Lovely Mandolang (student): Saya usually do not disturb friends who are praying and maintain peace around the place of worship.

Zulkifli Amir (student): indirectly, it usually happens when there is an assignment to divide groups for practice because considering that almost every subject has an assignment for practice, we in one class do not choose in determining friendships.

From the research data, students also trust each other in social interactions and mutual understanding and uphold an attitude of mutual respect among students at school. And be kind to everyone regardless of differences. By studying at school, they can apply it in their daily lives and the community environment wherever they are. 2. Discussion

The values of noble character which of course also support the formulation of multicultural values in everyday life. Students also have self-awareness in themselves to appreciate those around them. All students are able to mingle with other students without any problems with differences in terms of religion, ethnicity, and language differences.

D. Conclusion

Students' understanding of multicultural values can be seen from the way they socialize with each other without distinguishing between each other. Teachers also have an important role in providing an understanding of multicultural values, one example is providing issues about multicultural conflicts. Teachers provide understanding by implementing it in the learning process, namely discussion materials and group selection. This provides an understanding of multiculturalism.
